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## GUILD NOTES

BELLEVILLE GUILD—The first meeting of the Guild this fall was held on September 28, at St. Henry's College. Details of the meeting will be printed in the next issue of LINACRE.

Again this year, the Guild will sponsor the Health Program in the schools of the diocese. Both the doctors and dentists of the Guild give their services to the parochial schools, so that children attending these schools may have the same medical examinations that are received by the public school children. This plan has been worked out in such a manner that no school in the diocese is overlooked.

The Guild is also continuing its campaign against the display of indecent and obscene literature in drugstores and on news-stands. The aid of the Holy Name Societies has now been enlisted in this work.

Although announcement had been made in May that Monsignor Gruenewald, the very able and zealous Chaplain of the Guild, had been elevated to the rank of Domestic Prelate, the documents did not arrive until August, due to delays caused by the War. On Sunday, September 7, the formal investiture of Monsignor Gruenewald as Domestic Prelate took place. Bishop Althoff presided and Bishop Donnelly, Auxiliary Bishop of St. Louis, preached the sermon. The investiture was followed by a dinner in honor of Monsignor. The Federation and LINACRE join in extending sincerest congratulations to the recipient of this signal and well-merited honor.

NEW ORLEANS GUILD-A meeting of the Guild took place on July 23, at which Doctor Leckert presided. Father Stahl gave an interesting "Church talk on Music" bringing out the fact that this music must appeal to the listener's mind in such a way as to encourage prayer; not to entertain as at a concert.
