Last week I had the pleasure of a visit with Monsignor Colaneri relative to the matter I write about today. He advised me to address myself to you.


The need is very urgent that I have some funds to pay some current bills here. My fuel bill for the winter just passed is \$195.00. My grocery bill for the past 8 months has climbed to \$260.00.

The Indian Bureau has cut down my annual allowance by \$200.00. It may seem that I am inefficient. However, I am the first one who has been able to hold out here longer than a year at a time. Five attempts have been made before me. Were it not for the Indian children here it would certainly be most advisable to discontinue this place as a parish.

I beg you to consider my appeal charitably.
