Right Roverend dear Monsigner:

The mission of this letter is to put before the Bureau of Gathelic Indian Missions the case of the Russell family, Indians, registered in the Sioux Agency at Yankton, South Dakota, who, while living at Falls City, attended our school. They would not have been at any school had we not taken care of them. They still owe us about \$200 for books and tuition. We should appreciate it very much if some allowance could be made in our favor.

There is quite a mumber of Indian families tributary to Falls City, who have been baptized Catholics. Every year we have applications from these people who wish to send their children to our school but are not able to pay enough for us to accept them. If you could make a per capita allowance, we would try to take care of them. In our present condition, we can not do much charity work even though we believe these Indians could be saved for the Faith. Father Hoffmann, our pastor, has had charge of the Reservation of which we speak; he had erected a church there, which has since been abandoned. We enclose his letter, for further information.

May we know your decision on this point so that we can make arrangements for the opening of school in September? Thanking you for any account you may see fit to take of the above, we are,
