Rt. Rev. end dear Magr:

Expect to run out of Mass intentions in a week or ten days and would appreciate a few if you have them on hand.

There is a good Catholic woman by the name of Mrs. Brittain who was cook at the Sherman farm and her position has been abolished since September 1st. As a result she has been put on furlough for a year. She has asked me when writing you to mention her name in the hope that you might be able to do something to have her obtain some position before that time. She is fifteen years in the Service and her husband is an agricultural instructor at the school. They are good church supporters and naturally I'm interested.

Bear Father Lynch:

It was very unfortunate, but the Indian Office can not retract its decision to abolish this position. They also informed me that there are no vacancies elsewhere where Mrs. Brittain could be transferred as cook.

Dear Fother Lynch:

I have your letter of November 26, copy of which I enclose.

Under Section 130F(b) of the Indian Office Indian Schools regulations, a boy past 18 can go to any church he desires. Section 130 (b) reads as follows:

"Those who, regardless of previous affiliations, Christian or pagen, having attained the sge of 18 years, desire to become members of any denomination, shall be so classed."
