Dear Father Deutsch:

In the absence of Father Hughes, I have received your night letter of June 6 regarding Mr. James M. Rooney.

On inquiry at the Indian Office, I learn that the Salt River Agency is to be consolidated with the Phoenix Indian School, and that the agency and the school will be in charge of Mr. Brown, the Superintendent of Phoenix. I was told that Mr. Rooney would be retained as farmer at Salt River and probably would be put in charge of the reservation. This, however, has not been definitely settled, and will not be until after the Indian Office receives a report from Superintendent Brown as to the disposition of the employees at Salt River. I was promised that your recommendation of Mr. Rooney would be borne in mind. I am quite hopeful that Mr. Rooney will be placed in charge at Salt River.

Dear Rt. Rev. Bishop:

Many thanks for your check for \$100, which I received a few days ago. Such kindness and promptness gives me great encouragement.

I have had your bill for School Indemnity Insurance here on my desk since September, but was not able to pay it. Yesterday I finally received from the Bureau of Catholic Indian Missions the balance due for the quarter ending September 30th. Although I have many other outstanding bills, I hasten to pay yours first. Many thanks for your patience!

I am afraid we will not be able to continue much longer, if things do not begin to brighten up soon.

The appeal which I sent out with Your Lordship's permission and blessing is bringing in only very meager returns.

Two weeks ago I received our tax-bill. It jumped up from \$670 to \$919.74. It is terrible to be forced to beg from the public in order to pay taxes to the state, when we save the state thousands of dollars by taking care of these poorer children.

I am very anxious to learn whether your application for extra help met with any success. It would be a wonderful blessing just now.

Again thinking Your Lordship for all kindness and asking you to give to all of us your blessing, I remain your servant,

Dear Bishop Cantwell:

I am firmly convinced that the cost of conducting St. Boniface School can be greatly reduced, first, by decreasing the number of children there to the minimum at which they can operate economically, and, secondly, by sending as many children as possible to Los Angeles and points near thereto to be trained in Catholic homes of white people.

Five years trial of the Catholic outing system convinces me that it is the best of all. Thanks to your backing up of Father Albert Braun and his sister, Mrs. James J. McGrath, excellent results have been obtained. There are at present about 35 Indian children, nearly all girls, placed and watched over by Mrs. McGrath. Father O'Dwyer and his office force have greatly aided her.

Father Justin told me that he could pay all expenses at Banning with \$100 a child for 110 children. Under the outing system the only cost is that of transportation, and even that cost for the return home of the child is frequently paid by the Catholic family in Los Angeles after once the child has arrived and stayed a sufficient time. The children are given the best possible Catholic training, namely that of a Catholic home and parochial school. No boarding school with great numbers can possibly give the same individual attention. In the outing system, the child is taught to save his earnings by opening a bank account. The child's check will not be honored without the countersignature of the field matron. Take one example. Margaret Shosh, Mescalero Apache, has from time to time bought sheep and entrusted the sheep to her relatives who receive the wool, while Margaret gets the increase in lambs so that she can now return to her people and have a sufficient income from her flock to live. I know of no other system,--Governmental or Church-- which trades for and establishes any such economic independence.

For long years this Bureau has been paying Banning \$7,500 for 75 children. For the past few years I have been paying \$1,500 additional for 15 more pupils. The \$7,500 comes from the Lenten Collection and Mother Katharine. The \$1,500 comes from my collections through the mail and THE INDIAN SENTINEL. I am inclined to believe that \$7,500 would take care of 50 pupils in Banning School and \$1,500 would take care of the outing system for 50 or more children who are now in Banning. The \$7,500 would probably also take care of children passing via Banning School to the outing system.

No provision has been made for the expenses of Mrs. McGrath, the field matron. Some should be made. I have written her recently concerning this. I am inclined to think it could easily be paid out of the \$1,500.

Father Justin and the Sisters of St. Joseph will object to any other system than the expensive boarding school system. Could the outing system not be started right after Christmas? Meantime I will ask Mother Katharine if she will continue to pay her annual allotment of \$4,692. I think she will. Her concern is for souls not for any system.

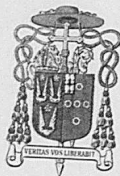

You understand that it is such friends, of which the Cardinal is the finest, that enable me to send your quarterly payment.

This amount will apply as follows: \$275, which is the amount due you from the Bureau's own collections, for excess pupils, for the quarter ending December 31, 1927, and \$225 towards the amount due you for the quarter ending March 31, 1927. For 15 excess pupils you are paid \$1100 annually out of the Bureau's own collections and \$400 annually out of the Lexten Collection. The total for 15 excess pupils is, therefore, \$1500.
