Rt. Rev. and Dear Father:

This will inform you that Miss E. Gendron's box was just received. By mistake it had been directed to Dodsan Montana. It must have been held at Dodson for a long time. You may tell Miss Bendron that her charity towards our poor little Indians was most appreciated. Everything in the box will be put to good use. God loves thoses that love his poor. I have all ready requested the Bureau on their occasions to take up the matter of having mothers Katherine give us allowance for 90 children instead of 70. I personally requested Mr. husk to bring this matter before your Reverence. I have never received even so much as an acknowledgement of my request. Is it possible that the matter has never been brought to your notice. I am only new at this work, yet I am trying to do something for our poor Indian children. Some 30 will make their first commandians this year at St. Paul's. We poor missionaries don't ask the Bureau for the impossible, but we have a right tosome incouragement. If what I ask is impossible at least we could be notified of that fact. Mr. E.M. Byrn of the parquette League wrote in wovember stating that they expected to be able to help St. Paul. Mothing has been received so far. What good Fr. Nexte wrote of the building at St. Andrews can will be said of St. Paul's. I cannot allow the Sisters to pass another winter under the same conditions as they just passed. Our Lord does not demand it. If no hope is held out for a betterment of conditions I will have to make my decion accordingly.

Rt. Rev. Dear Monsignor:

Yours of the 22nd inst. just received. Our good Bishop is in Rome just now, and is not expected to return until late in July. I do not anticipate any difficulty as to the remaining of the present chapel, 5t. Leo. With five hundred dollars we could make the present little Chapel look very presentate. And I thin would satisfy most of the Indians. Would the donor, Mrs. Fehn, agree to this. Work could be begun on this Chapel as soon as the Bishop arrives. As I have said before the Church is only used in the summer months by Father Sansone. We have no way of attending it in winter. Father Sansone has to drive over there from the mission with a horse and buggy, a distance of 49 miles. No great progress can be looked for unless we can get a good Catechist, and get better facilities of keeping in touch with these people. In time, the place will be attended to from Harlem. Harlem is builting a new Church, or rather they got permission to build. It will take some years before they will be in a position to support a pastor. The Father from Chinook, comes to Harlem and the agency, which is about six miles from Harlem. The little chapelis some nine miles from the agency.

Under the present circumstances, the repair of the old chapel is the most logical thing to do. And, probably Mrs. Folin would have no difficulty in consenting to this. The building of a new chapel would be very expensive, since the material will have to be hauled into long distance. At lodge Pole, the Rock was close by, the lime was burnt and brought from the mission at very little expense. The lumber for the most part was logged and saved at the government mill at Lodge Pole. None of these conditions are verified at the other Chapel.

They were wonderfully attentive and kept very strict silence. The parents were told that no visits would be allowed during the rotreat. It was observed to the letter. Two of the Indians asked to make the retreat with the children. They went into the retreat with great earnestness. We had 46 first Communicants. The large majority of them are daily Communicants. I am sure that the good mothers would be very much consoled to see the little ones. Most of them did not know a prayer when they came to us last fail. We should get means of going amongst them more frequently. God's will be done.

Dear Father Levasseur: I have had your requests for money for the building up of an industrial department as well as your requests for money for the building up of an industrial department as well as your request for an automobile constantly before me since you made the requests on September 22 of last year. The best I have been able to do is to put the appeals in THE INDIAN SENTINGL. The Bureau has no money except that which it gots from the SENTINGL. While no answer has come to either of your requests, other priests have received gifts of automobiles. So some, at least, have had their man's satisfied. I regret exceedingly that the Bureau can not at present provide the money for such roal needs as that of the industrial department and the increased num-What future hopes have I? Our answer was in the name of the Bureau. Mother Katharine has not yet replied to your request. Of the \$7,000 which is paid you for seventy pupils at \$100 per capita, Mother Kathurine pays \$4,408 and the Bureau \$2,592. The Bureau is unfortunately not able to increase its amount. I have not much hope that Mother Katharine can make an increase. In the past three years I have asked for no increases and no new allowances from Mother Katharine: (1) because she has not sufficient money and (2) because I believe that it is high time that we should try to prepare for the inevitable cessation of all financial help from the estate of Mother Katharine's father. Upon her death probably and upon the death also of her sister Wrs. Morrell, certainly that source of revenue will cease.
