ARTICLE 1. The party of the second part, for and in consideration of the compensation
hereinafter named, agrees:

1. To support, maintain, and educate under this contract, at the Industrial Boarding School

Red Lake Indian
on the Minnesota Reservation, known as St. Mary's Mission School
Reservation, Minnesota, with a capacity and the necessary

appliances for the healthful accommodation of all the pupils enrolled
Twelve (12) months, commencing July 1, forty-eight,
during one hundred twenty (120) in a manner satisfactory to the party of the first part, an average, if practicable, of

one hundred twenty (120) Indian pupils, the total number attending the school at any
one time not to exceed its capacity.

2. To enroll no pupil under this contract who is under six or over twenty years of age, provided, however, that any pupil over twenty years of age and under twenty-three years of age who was attending said school during the fiscal year ending June 30, 19forty-seven, may be continued in said school during the current fiscal year.

3. All Indian children, before being accepted as pupils by the party of the second part, shall be certified to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs by the agency physician, or other authorized physician, as in good health and sound physical condition.

4. To procure pupils under this contract, if otherwise eligible under this contract, only from
children of duly enrolled members of the Chippewa

Sioux Indians of the Red Lake
tribe of Indians, now under the supervision of the
and Consolidated Chippewa Agency, Minnesota.

5. To enroll no pupil under 6, or over 21 years of age, except as provided for in section 2, article 1, without special permission therefor from the Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

6. To provide for said school a sufficient number of employees to conduct it to the satisfaction of the party of the first part, presenting satisfactory evidences of the qualifications of each instructor, all employees to converse with pupils under their charge in English, and to be able to speak and write in the English language fluently and correctly; to instruct the male pupils of said school in gardening and farming and care of stock, or such other industries as are suitable to their reservation; to instruct certain of the male pupils in mechanical trades; to instruct the female pupils in cookery, laundering, needlework, dairy work, and general housewifery; to teach all the pupils in the ordinary branches of an English education; to teach the effects of alcoholic drinks and narcotics on the human system, as required by act approved May 20, 1886; to observe with appropriate public exercises all national holidays; to instruct pupils as to the duties and privileges of American citizenship.

7. To supply the pupils of said school with suitable and sufficient clothing, subsistence, lodging accommodations, medical attendance, medicines, school books, stationery, school appliances, and all other articles necessary to their personal comfort; and also to supply the school with mechanical tools, seeds, and all other articles necessary in a properly conducted industrial school.

8. To have school-room exercises on five and industrial exercises on six days in each week, legal holidays and five days at Christmas excepted, and excepting also a vacation not to exceed months within the fiscal year, unless otherwise expressly agreed, provided that period is covered by this contract, during which vacation there need be no school-room exercises, and the pupils may, in the discretion of the party of the second part, be relieved from industrial work, and permitted to visit their homes at no expense to the party of the first part for transportation either going or returning.

9. To report concerning said school as required, and on blank forms to be furnished by the party of the first part.

10. Not to transfer this contract or any interest therein, as provided by section 3737 of the United States Revised Statutes, to any party or parties, it being understood that if this contract or any interest therein shall be transferred by the party of the second part, by that act the party of the first part will be relieved from all obligations under the contract; but all rights of action for breach of the contract by the party of the second part will be reserved to the party of the first part.

ARTICLE 2. The party of the first part, in consideration of the faithful performance of the aforesaid agreements and stipulations by the party of second part, agrees:

1. To pay said party of the second part at the rate of Forty-one dollars and
sixty-six and two-thirds cents (\$41.66-2/3)
per quarter as compensation for every pupil in attendance under the provisions and restrictions of this contract, and authorized to be received under section 4, article 1 hereof, payment for each quarter to be computed on the average attendance of pupils in such quarter,
provided that pupils enrolled prior thereto whether or not present in

shall be reported as in attendance for the purpose of payment thereunder

ARTICLE 3. The party of the first part reserves the right:

1. To abrogate this contract in the following manner and for the following reasons: (a) On a notice of fifteen days, given in writing to the party of the second part, provided that the party of the second part has failed to comply with the agreements and stipulations of this contract, the fifteen days' notice to be counted from and to include the day on which the notice is served personally by a duly authorized officer of the United States Government on the party of the second part, or is left by such officer at the schoolhouse of the Industrial Boarding School above mentioned. (b) On a notice of sixty days, given in writing to the party of the second part, and for any reason satisfactory to the party of the first part, the sixty days' notice to be counted from and to include the day on which the notice is served personally on, or is left at the schoolhouse of, the party of the second part, in the manner provided above for serving notice of the abrogation of this contract for failure of the party of the second part to comply with the agreements and stipulations thereof.

2. To make inspections of the said school, and to require the party of the second part at any time immediately to dismiss from the service of the school all school employees who may be considered by the party of the first part not qualified for the respective positions occupied by them in the school.

ARTICLE 4. It is expressly agreed and stipulated by and between the parties to this contract:

1. That this contract may, by mutual consent, be changed, altered, modified, amended, or abrogated, in whole or in part, provided such change, alteration, modification, or amendment does not affect the rate or amount of compensation or fund out of which payment is to be made, or eligibility of pupils.

2. That no Member of or Delegate to Congress, Resident Commissioner, officer, agent, or other employee of the Government, shall be admitted to any share or part in this contract, or derive any pecuniary benefit therefrom.

3. That where the word "eligible," in relation to children or pupils, occurs in this contract it is mutually understood that said children or pupils are those provided for under section 4, article 1 hereof.

ARTICLE 5. This agreement is made subject to the approval of the Secretary of the Interior.
