I received your letter of Feb. 10 enclosing check from Marquette League - Thanks for same. I have written letter of acknowledgement to Fr. Flynn as requested.

We have had a real hard winter this year - long spells of snow & cold - We hope it will not continue much longer as it would prove disastrous to man & beast. I must admit that I am feeling uneasy from a financial point of view. The M.K. allowance for Dec. quarter has not yet come & I have a bill of over \$400.00 in flour to pay besides the Mrs. salary for that quarter; must order another car of coal very soon, & my teachers are asking for their salary. I have not heard whether the Commission has allotted us any of the funds collected for the Missions or not - so I am in a state of suspense as to what to do & what to expect.

As I explained in my letter, the delay was caused by the failure of two missionaries to send in their quarterly reports promptly. I asked Mother Katharine kindly to make payment without waiting on all reports. She refused.

The Commission allotted to Helena Diocese \$5000 special in addition to the \$1800 regular. The \$5000 was sent to the Administrator by Doctor Temmelly about ten days ago. Doctor Temmelly did not specify whether all of this is to go to you. You should apply for it to Monsignor Day.

The donor of the engine, Mr. J. Hiland read in THE INDIAN SENTINEL the name of Sister St. Thomas. So as not to cause him confusion, I am giving him shipping instructions for shipment to her. It is for the mission in any case.

Let me know if it will serve any purpose. If only for emergency it will still be valuable.
