Dear Father or Dear Sister:

(The following is being sent to our mission boarding schools but not to our day schools because we thought the needs of children in our day schools would be taken care of directly by Government superintendents from the supply they got. If not, you should consult your superintendent. Please report to this Bureau.)

I am reliably informed that there are still available some of the following articles from surplus War Department property: Drawers, wool, winter; Undershirts, wool, winter; Stockings, wool, heavy; Gloves, woolen, O.D. If needed by the children, you should make application for these articles by letter to your superintendent, telling him that your information comes from Washington as of this date.

You did not report to me whether you got any of the surplus goods about which I wrote you on November 14. As soon as you secure them, please answer. The information will be very helpful to me. Or if you do not receive any, let me know the reason.

Dear Sir:

Referring to your inquiry concerning assistance through the distribution of wheat under control of the Red Cross Society, I have to advise that under date of the 2nd inst. the Commissioner of Indian Affairs informed this office that:

"The matter of whether such institutions can be allowed to participate in the distribution of this wheat by the Red Cross is now under consideration, but we are unable to foresee what the final decision will be. If the decision is in favor of such assistance your request will receive attention."

It will be observed I am without authority to arrange for the distribution of any flour for the Indians of this jurisdiction to your institution. It is my understanding that each county & town have applications pending for flour for relief purposes & the aid obtained should assist materially in relieving distress among adults.

I regret that I am not in a position to offer you any encouragement for assistance to your schools.

Referring to your letter of March 11 last with regard to certain flour anticipated for distribution through the Red Cross, I have to advise that the Indian Office has authorized me to issue a limited amount of flour from our allotment to such institutions as have taken in additional children because of the acute economic conditions.

We have a limited amount of flour on hand at the agency from which I could spare your institution 1000 # provided you can arrange to take care of the cost of transportation. If you will advise me on this point I will forward the flour to you by freight collect.

Dear Father Ludger:

I have your letter of May 15 enclosing copy of a letter of May 10 from Superintendent Jermark to you.

From the reports that we have received from other mission schools of the flour that was given them, you would not be asking for too much if you sent in a requisition for 5,000 pounds.

In a letter dated May 4 from Commissioner Rhoads to Indian Superintendents, he says: "If any of the mission schools under your jurisdiction desire any of the flour or crushed wheat and you are able to furnish the amount desired from the supply which has already been shipped you or which you later receive, we want you to do so. If your supply is insufficient to take care of the immediate needs of the outside schools, it will be necessary that they submit through you a request for a shipment of an additional supply."

To All Catholic Indian Missionaries:

Referring to my circular letter of March 8 to all Catholic Indian missionaries, I immediately thereafter took up with the Red Cross and the Indian Office the question whether flour and/or wheat could be supplied by the Superintendent to our mission schools. The Indian Office asked the Red Cross to give formal consent. The Red Cross has just consented.

If your Superintendent has given you a supply of flour or wheat, I believe that the Superintendent did right and he is now backed by authority of the Indian Office.

The Indian Office has sent a letter to each Superintendent instructing him to assist mission schools (at least for the extra number of children taken in because of the hard times) out of the supply already received by him. If this causes a shortage in the Superintendent's supply, he can then, according to the Indian Office statement, put in a subsequent requisition to make up the deficit.

You may show this letter to the Superintendent if you wish.

For your information I quote the full paragraph of the Commissioner's letter. I did not in the letter which you may send to Superintendent Baumgarten. It is up to him to lock it up. "Cotton goods may be issued to mission schools on the same basis as flour was issued; that is, only those schools which have taken in additional pupils as a relief measure are entitled to such assistance. Outside of the record, the Indian Office is not as restricted in its relief measures as is the last clause above."

Dear Rev. Wegemer:

I have just received your letter & in answer to it will say that I have not received any positive information as to the amount of Red Cross cotton goods that this office is to receive. If no more Red Cross goods is coming in than we have now it will be impossible to issue your school anything.

I wish also to say that before any issue is made to your school that it is my intention to take care of those mission schools who take the children from this jurisdiction. As far as I know there are no children who claim this office as their agency who are in your school. We have been furnishing Red Cross flour to the Catholic missions at Baraga, Odanah, Bayfield & Red Cliff.

There is nothing I can do for your school at this time & I do not wish it understood that I am definitely refusing you any assistance until I know what piece goods will be sent us & what demand the Catholic missions from this district will make upon our supply.

- (2) The funds obtained from Holy Childhood should be expended exclusively on pagan children whom the missionaries baptize, ransom and educate.
