able to help the second.

We are pleased with them [the Indian girls]
so far, and hope Our Lord
will assist us in training
them to be good Catholics.

Reverend Father,

Your letter to Father Stephen, of the 1st inst., with enclosed School Report for September, duly received, and Father Stephen being still absent in the West, is answered by me.

There were no 2nd Readers among the books donated by Rev. Mr. Anthony, and consequently none could be sent you. We will, however, endeavor to secure 50 2nd Readers, and, if successful, will forward them to you. I think you must have ^{mis-} understood about the Stationery; our Bureau has never furnished any to any of our schools, and however much we might desire to do so, it could not be done now for want of funds.

The School Report is all right, except that you should give the names of the teachers.

You should sign and swear to before a Notary Public or a Clerk of a Court, Vouchers in duplicate after the form which I enclose herewith, and send same to this Bureau accompanied by another copy of the School Report for September.

I enclose, herewith, for your information, copy of contract for the education of 80 Indian Girls at your school.
