Dear Bishop Noll:

I have read with interest your very informative articles concerning The American Board of Catholic Missions which appeared in The Acolyte of February 12 and The Missionary Catechist of February. My particular interest is founded on the hope that your Board may be able to supply some of the pressing needs of Indian missions. I find it increasingly difficult to get stringless gifts which can be used by me in the payment of annual pledges which are especially for the maintenance of schools. The Indian Sentinel, in the new form and content which I have given it during the past five years, gets many replies to particular appeals. I can not, therefore, meet new requests to be paid from stringless gifts. Nor can I hope to keep up other obligations than schools. The only thing I can do is to refer requests to the Commission for the Distribution of the Lenten Collection and in the event that the Commission has not sufficient funds, to recommend that the applicants appeal to your Board. In September 1926, at the Catholic University, you told me that applicants might so appeal. Of course, they must appeal through their Bishops.

May I ask, without offense, if so far any aid has been given to United States Indians (as distinguished from Mexicans)? In your article in The Missionary Catechist you state that your Board "will later meet with the Bishops who have their own peculiar problems in our Northwest". I suppose these problems will include Indian missions. Could you give me some idea when this meeting will be? The purpose of this question is that I may let Indian missionaries know how soon they must make applications to their Bishops.

Personally I am very much encouraged by the increased interest in missions. But you will understand dear Bishop that my inquiry is entirely informal and somewhat confidential. I have no authority to deal with any Board except, first, the Board of this Bureau and secondly, (but only upon invitation) the Commission. The personnel of the Commission and the Buareu Board are the same.
