Dear Brother Danahy:

In order to get the wholesale discounts on statues and church goods for shipment to Alaska, I am writing to the Seattle church goods house. This Bureau always gets wholesale prices, because we buy so much.

Mistake was made by us this time last year in buying a statue in Chicago and shipping by express. The express from Chicago to Alaska was \$10.34 and the statue costing only \$4.05. We should be able to save on express by buying in Seattle.

In your letter of June 2, 1929, you said that you found the price of this statue in Seattle was \$4.50, the list price which we stated. But we did not pay \$4.50. We got 10% off. Confidentially, that is all Daleiden of Chicago allows. I buy very little from him. But the St. Paul Statuary Company does not have small composition statues. In the strictest confidence, also, I may tell you that the St. Paul Statuary Company would have charged me only \$3 for the same statue. Do not quote these discounts to any dealer. There is another reason why I buy from Daleiden: he has been very generous to the Franciscan missions of the southwest.

Hereafter, I will save up all orders for shipment to Alaska until you are making a large shipment. I will allow you the regular freight rate. You might determine for me what the average rate is for 100 pounds to inland points. We would make that the rate. I would collect from donors. But I would pay you beforehand.

Your letter of March nineteenth was forwarded to me and as I did not have the freight classification I have delayed answering it till now. According to the freight classification statuary takes a 1st class rate. Therefore the rate for statuary from Seattle to Holy Cross is \$6.98 per one hundred pounds. That is the rate to practically all of our inland Missions. To places like Hooper Bay and Kashunak the Mission boat takes care of the shipment from Holy Cross.

I have the statue, pedestal and plate for Kashunak in storage at Seattle. I also had it insured. These will be shipped to Holy Cross with the first shipment. There will be no charge made for the storage in Seattle. It is not practical to send shipments to the Alaska Missions by Express. Parcel Post is better, but even that is not handled from September to April.

Your Eminence:

Because the Indian Office can not figure ahead for the fiscal year 1931, I am compelled to accept contracts for the three schools in Oklahoma which have Chickasaw pupils with the provision: "Provided, however, that payments shall only be made hereunder if and when funds are available."

The Tribal Fund from which Chickasaw pupils are paid is derived from the sale of land. Purchasers have defaulted, at least temporarily, in payments. The Indian Office assures me that they believe payments will ultimately be made. But there may be a delay. If so, payments to the schools will be delayed.

In each of the three schools there are about as many Choctaw pupils as Chickasaw. The Choctaw payments will be made promptly by the Government.

The Sisters will naturally be fearful of accepting Chickasaw pupils for whom payment will not be made. The school can scarcely be conducted with Choctaw pupils only.

Would it be possible for the Commission for the Distribution of the Lenten Collection to guarantee to the Sisters quarterly payments for Chickasaw children on condition that the Commission would be reimbursed by the Sisters upon receipt of Government pay for Chickasaw children?

The amounts for the four quarters of the fiscal year 1931, the first quarter of which ends September 30, 1930, are as follows:

St. Agnes, annually for 44 Chickasaw	\$5500
St. Joseph, " 15 "	1875
St. Elisabeth " 14 "	1750
Total 73	\$9125

This means a guarantee of a quarterly advance of \$2,281.25.

I recommend the guarantee first, because I believe the Indian Office will pay and, secondly, because without the guarantee the three schools with a total of 180 Choctaw and Chickasaw children will probably be closed.

My dear Monsignor:

Your esteemed letter of May 17th, 1930, in reference to three Indian Schools in Oklahoma, has been received.

You ask whether it will be possible for the Negro and Indian Board to guarantee to the Sisters in charge of said schools quarterly payments for Chickasaw children, said payments to be made out of the Lenten Collection.

It would be a sad thing if these schools had to be closed because the Sisters are not guaranteed payments for the Chickasaw pupils.

No one can tell how much the Lenten Collection for the Negroes and Indians will amount to and it may be imprudent to guarantee payments from it, tantamount to taking a leap in the dark.

I am only one of said Board and cannot speak for the other members.

It has occurred to me that maybe the Bureau of Catholic Indian Missions could handle such a proposition itself, by making a special appeal for the required amount.

However, if you think fit, you may consult also the other members of the Board for Negroes and Indians, sending them, if you please, a copy of this my letter, together with a copy of your own letter addressed to me on May 17th last.

Your Eminence:

I have the letter of Your Eminence of December 5.

I called on Secretary of the Interior Wilbur and presented the two names of Admiral Benson and Rear Admiral Lowndes, saying that Your Eminence would be pleased with the appointment of either and that, in that connection, the name of Your Eminence might be mentioned to the President.

The Secretary seemed much impressed. He asked if Doctor Eliot had gotten in touch with me. I replied that he had phoned me and I had seen him. The Secretary asked me "also" to get in touch with Doctor Eliot.

Doctor Eliot had not told me that the Secretary wished him to get in touch with me but had simply said that the Secretary wished to handle the matter through Doctor Eliot.

At that time I replied to Doctor Eliot that probably His Eminence, Cardinal Dougherty, would write directly to the President. I did not remark it to Doctor Eliot. But I then determined that if I received any directions from Your Eminence permitting me to call on anyone, I would certainly call directly on the Secretary.

At the request of the Secretary I have now written Doctor Eliot.

Since the letter of Your Eminence said that either of the two would be good, and since Admiral Benson is so extremely busy but Admiral Lowndes wants something to busy him, I took the liberty of calling this morning on Vice President Curtis who is a personal friend of Admiral Lowndes. I told the Vice President, who is also a personal friend of mine, that I came to present to him the names of the two persons recommended by Your Eminence, for the Vice President to take any action he might see fit. He said that he would get in touch with the Secretary of the Interior today.

I am taking the liberty of sending this letter to Your Eminence as well as to a number of Archbishops and Bishops who in the past have given special aid to Indian missions.

A real emergency exists in American Indian missions. The drought has added greatly to the distress of the missions which absolutely depend on their crops to live. Priests and Sisters plead for money to buy food.

There are 7,000 children in our mission schools. Many are orphans. A Sister Superior writes: "Our Reverend Mother was here and she thinks that we will have to withdraw if things do not take a turn for the better. In case we have to close, what shall we do with the 21 orphans that are with us? They have no one to look after them but ourselves. If thrown out in the world, they surely would lose their Faith."

Any added charity which Your Eminence can extend to the Indian missions will be most helpful and welcome. I will be pleased to name a specific need or forward any gift.
