Dom Vincent Martin, O.S.B., Ph.D., now of St. Gabriel's Priory, Weston, Vt., was of late, Master of St. Andrew's Priory, Los Angeles. He was born and raised in Belgium. His father and two brothers are doctors there. Father Vincent received his Ph.D. in Sociology from Harvard in 1950 and wrote "The Belgian Strike" at the request of the editor, one of his oblates.

LINACRE QUARTERLY is a "journal of the philosophy and ethics of medical practice." In line with its policy of furnishing as broad coverage as possible in these areas it has assembled a distinguished corps of "Corresponding Editors" scattered at strategic listening-posts throughout the Catholic medical world. In Manila, for example, is the well-known cardiologist of Sto. Tomas University, Mariano Alimurung. Rheumatologist, litterateur, and philosopher, Michael Kelly reports from Melbourne. The letter from Vancouver gynecologist J. B. Costello appears in this issue. Aberdonian Andrew Gunn, Londoners W. B. J. Pemberton and J. V. O'Sullivan, and R. F. Added to the roster as of this issue are two corresponding editors who bid fair to sharpen our appreciation of the inscrutable East and who should be comfortable and congenial members of the corps. First, there is Chong-Eun (Joannes) Kim, M.D., Associate Professor and Chairman of the Department of Neuropsychiatry at Catholic Medical College and St. Mary's Hospital in Seoul, Korea. And reporting from Tokyo will be Professor T. E. Miura, who is Chairman of the Department of Neuropsychiatry at the School of Medicine, Keio University, and president of the Japanese Catholic Physicians' Society. *Dōzo itsu de mo oidé kudasái, gentlemen!* (Glad you are visiting us!)
