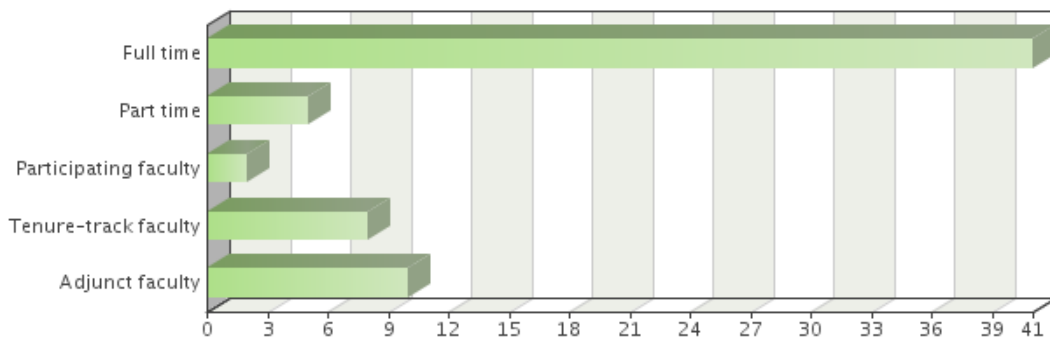

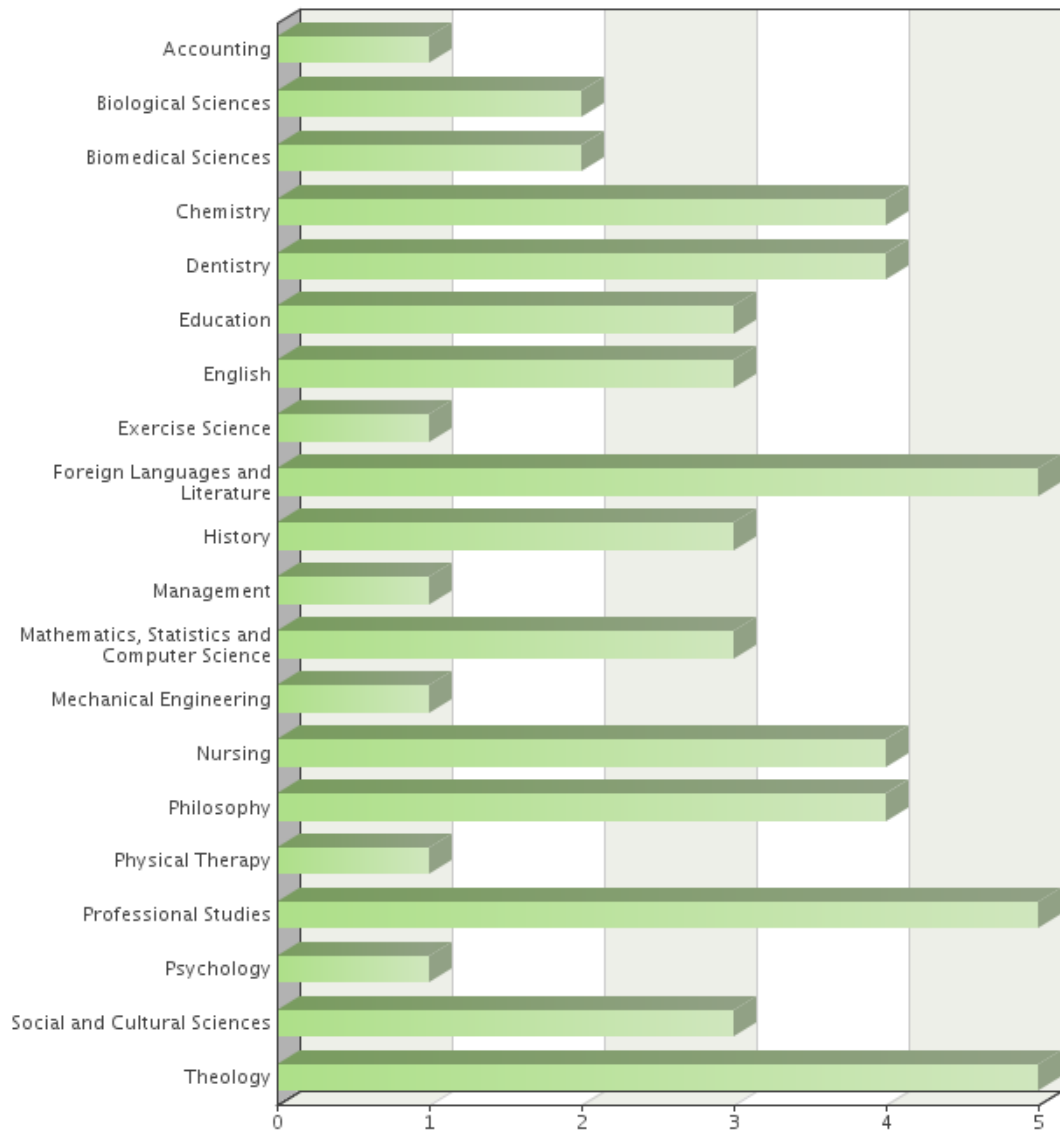

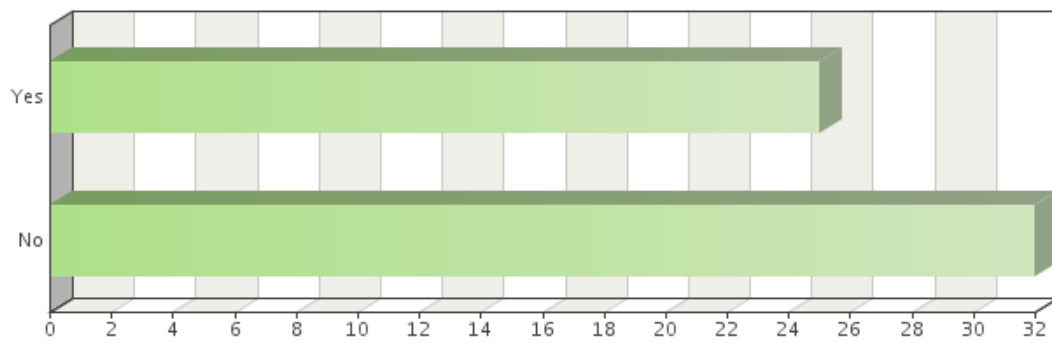

Do you use e-Publications for the deposit of your scholarly work?

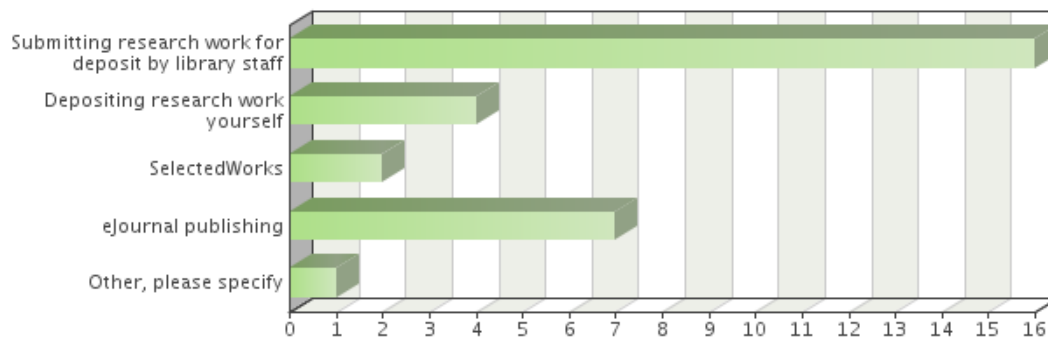

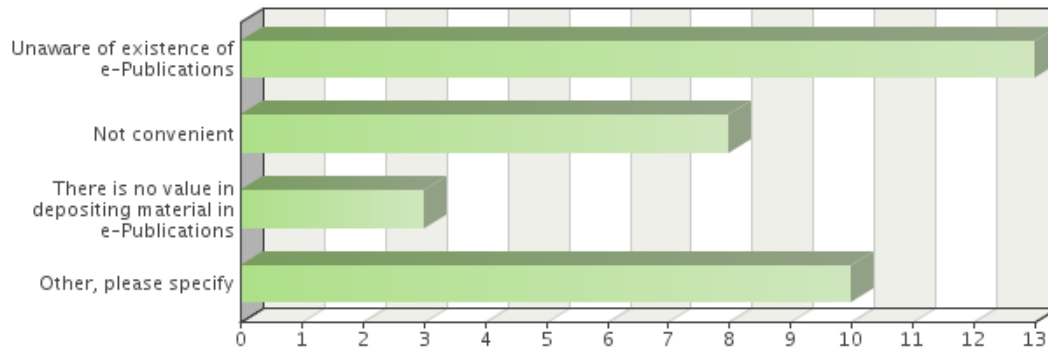

I have not made a close enough study of the open access operation to date. My publications reach their intended audiences via traditional means, and those publications are also held in Marquette libraries for others' use.

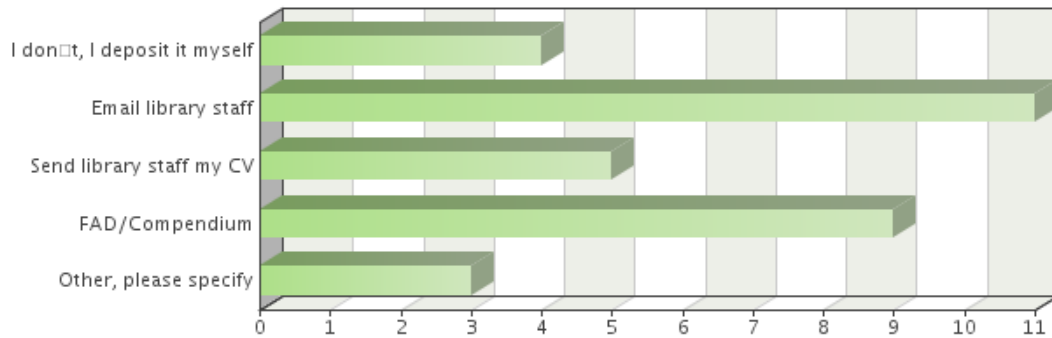

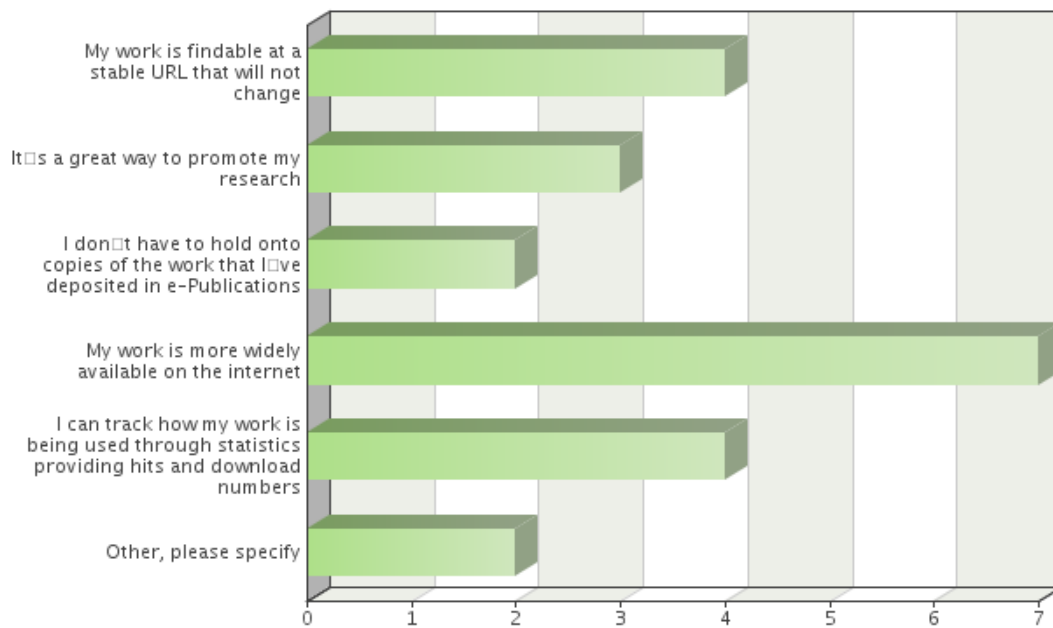

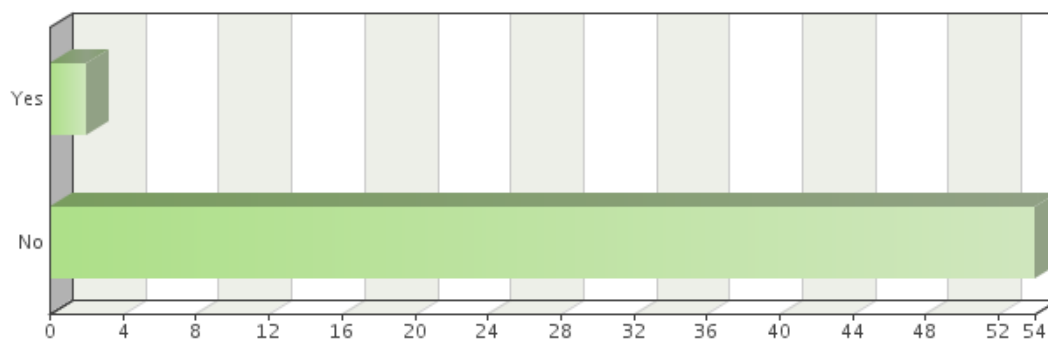

Do you use e-Publications for the deposit of your students' significant work?

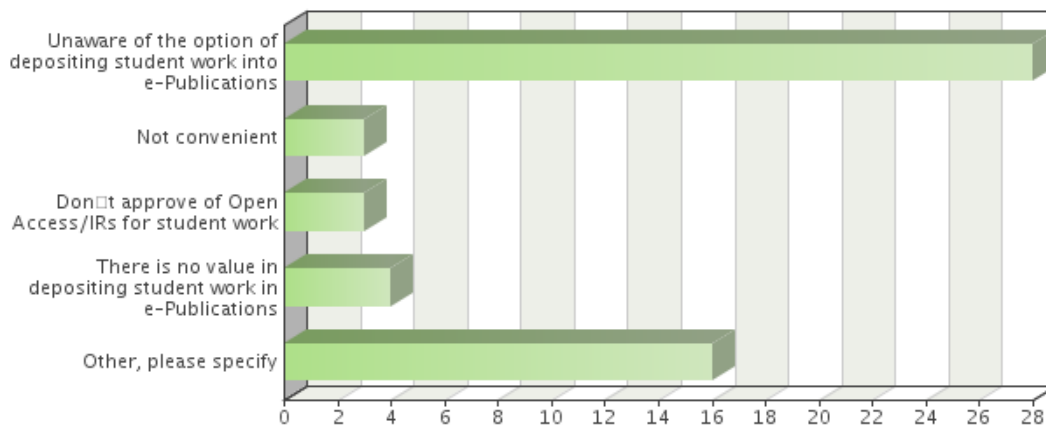

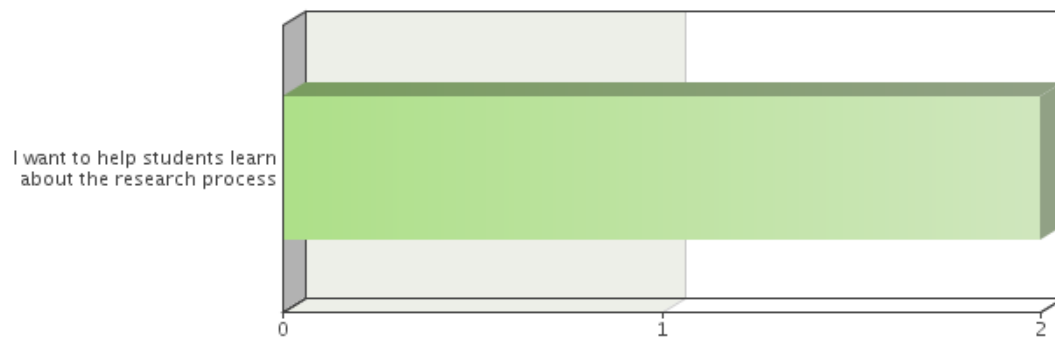

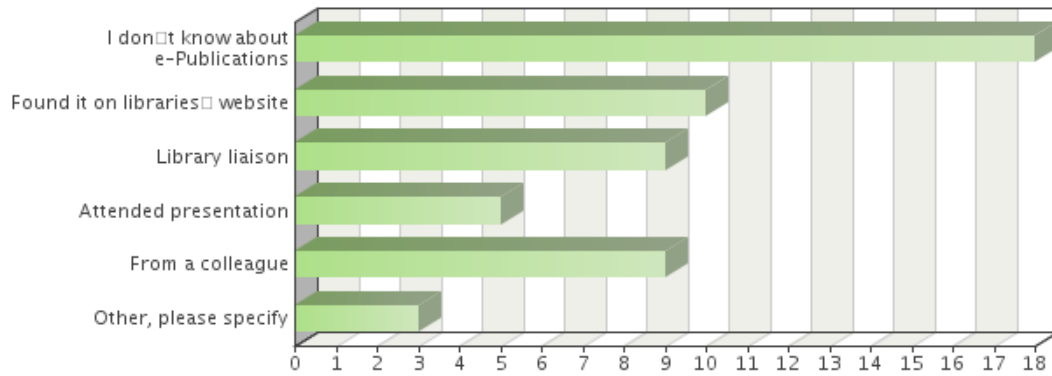
